Animal safety

At school, we are helping children learn how to stay safe around dogs and understand the importance of caring for them properly. Dogs can be wonderful companions, but it's important that children know how to behave safely—such as not approaching unfamiliar dogs, always asking permission before stroking one, and staying calm and gentle around them.

Looking after a dog is a big responsibility, and they need proper food, exercise, love, and training to stay happy and healthy. By teaching children to respect dogs and understand their needs, we can help keep everyone safe and encourage kind, responsible behaviour towards animals.



Caring for animals

Here are some rules to follow for looking after animals:

- Give fresh food and water every day – Animals need proper nutrition and clean water to stay healthy.
- Keep them clean and safe – Make sure their living space is tidy, warm, and protected from danger.
- Be gentle and kind – Always handle animals carefully and never shout at or hurt them.
- Exercise and play – Many animals need daily playtime or walks to stay happy and fit.
- Check on them every day – Animals can't tell us when something's wrong, so it's important to notice if they seem unwell or sad.
- Take them to the vet when needed – Just like people, animals need health check-ups and help when they are sick.
- Never leave them alone for too long – Animals need company and can get lonely or frightened.
- Learn about their needs – Different animals need different care. Always find out how to look after your pet properly.
